## Practice

- Go through the words in the exercise, making sure that students understand all the adjectives.
- Look at the example with the class and then do question 2 as a further example. Remind students of the use of *more* for the comparative form of longer adjectives.
- Students write the other sentences themselves. They could then compare answers in pairs.
- Check carefully to make sure that students have used *as* and *than* correctly. Also check the spelling of *sunnier* and *noisier*, reminding the class that adjectives ending in consonant + *y* have an *ier* ending in the comparative form.

### Answers

- 2 Richie's house isn't as comfortable as George and Marlene's house. George and Marlene's house is more comfortable than Richie's house.
- 3 Detroit isn't as sunny as Cancun. Cancun is sunnier than Detroit.
- 4 Marlene's house isn't as interesting as Richie's island. Richie's island is more interesting than Marlene's house.
- 5 Cancun isn't as noisy as Detroit. Detroit is noisier than Cancun.
- 6 Villages aren't as polluted as big cities. Big cities are more polluted than villages.

- As in 4c in Step 1, write up some pairs of nouns (for example: *England/Australia, horses/sheep*) and elicit some comparisons using different adjectives.
  - Students write their own 'skeleton' sentences to give to their partner.

Pairs could do a role play as George and Marlene on Richie's island. Give them some ideas to start them off, for example:


GEORGE: He hasn't got a microwave!

MARLENE: No, but he's got a solar cooker.

GEORGE: It isn't as big as our electric cooker.

And he hasn't got a television!

MARLENE: No, but he's got ...
